Plagiarism will automatically disqualify an entry.)</p> <p>The term, "American Dream," conveys the concept of a peaceful nation where one can enjoy freedom, co-exist alongside one another, and compete freely while guaranteed the right to opportunity and happiness. For the soldiers of the 100th infantry Battalion WWII (Separate), what elements of the America Dream were they hoping to solidify not only for their families and friends but also for the communities of Hawaii? How are the elements of the American Dream connected to their Japanese Cultural values? Use MLA Guidelines to document your sources. A minimum of five sources should be listed on a Works cited page.
